1. Introduction

Founded in 1909 as an evangelical Anglican foundation, St John's College has over the years pursued a two-fold vision: to offer training for church leaders within a world-class university while also offering Christian hospitality to students from a wide range of academic disciplines at undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

Cranmer Hall, the theological college within St John's College, offers theological training for both Anglican ordinands and also trainee Free Church ministers, in addition to independent undergraduates and postgraduates studying theology, ministry and mission within a confessional context. Rooted in an evangelical tradition, Cranmer Hall has over the years proved a generous home for people training from a range of Christian backgrounds.

2. Free Church Track – Background and Vision

The Free Church Track (FCT) was established at Cranmer Hall in 2015 to train missional leaders in and for the North East. It offers students the opportunity to deepen their faith and understanding through the world-class theological resources of Durham University and put it into practice through mission and ministry in local churches and regional ministries. Over 40 women and men have come from a range of independent churches and denominations and have pursued studies at undergraduate and postgraduate level, going on to fruitful leadership across the North East and beyond.

While the students pursue different academic courses flexibly suited to their needs, all FCT students take part in the weekly Missional Leadership Seminar on a Tuesday afternoon, which provides an important chance for mission-focussed leadership training and peer-based support and prayer. We believe there is potential to develop this course from autumn 2020 through a renewed focus on Bible, leadership and church planting/pioneering, and increasing access across a range of Christian leadership contexts.

Alongside partnerships with a range of local churches, we have established a formal partnership with the Northern Baptist Association and Northern Baptist College, enabling students to train towards ordination as Baptist ministers on a Cranmer course while taking part in sessions at NBC. Donaldson serves as the Baptist Track Hub Tutor and we are keen to see this partnership grow and develop in the years to come.

Within Cranmer Hall's overall vision of expanding our capacity to resource the church in theological formation and training, we are keen to make the most of online learning possibilities to expand the reach of the FCT within the North East and beyond. This is likely to involve greater access to single modules, training for lay leaders and continuous development opportunities for church leaders. We expect a FCT Director to contribute positively towards this.

Overall, we are very excited about the next chapter in the life of the FCT. The new full-time FCT Director will have the opportunity not only to develop the delivery of the Free Church Track within Cranmer Hall but also work creatively in partnership with others to see potential leaders and ministers from free churches identified and trained across the North East and beyond. We believe that greater engagement with local churches and other partners will be a blessing not only to the FCT but, more importantly, to the mission of God in the region and beyond.

3. Role Overview

With the support of the Vardy Foundation we are pleased to be appointing the first full-time Director of the Free Church Track at Cranmer Hall (the previous Director oversaw the FCT alongside wider teaching responsibilities within Cranmer Hall.)

The role of Director of the Free Church Track at Cranmer Hall will be to lead the further development of the FCT within Cranmer Hall, increasing its capacity to serve the local and wider church through being a place of outstanding theological and missional training for Christian leaders. The role will involve an equal focus on external engagement (including networking and building relationships with leaders, churches and missional initiatives across the North East) as it will on internal programme delivery and pastoral support.

4. Key responsibilities

- To oversee the strategic development and effective delivery of the Free Church Track at Cranmer Hall. This will include developing and communicating a clear vision to students and stakeholders.
- To develop strong relationships with key stakeholders (e.g. church leaders) throughout the NE and beyond. This will involve preaching and teaching at churches and ministry events as opportunities arise, and also exploring new ways to bring theological training and resourcing into the life of local churches.
- To further strengthen and develop the partnership with the Northern Baptist College and Northern Baptist Association.
- To articulate to potential students a compelling vision for training at Cranmer Hall, leading to effective recruitment from across the North-East and beyond. This will involve creative strategies to work with local churches to identify men and women as future potential leaders and develop their sense of call.
- To lead an effective recruitment process for new students, working with the Admissions Secretary of Cranmer Hall.
- To lead the Missional Leadership Seminar, a two-year ministry training course that takes place weekly during Michaelmas and Epiphany terms. Teaching may be delivered by the FCT Director,

other Cranmer staff members and some outside, significant missional leaders. The FCT Director would be responsible for marking assignments set during the course.

- To serve as a pastoral tutor for up to 12 FCT students and ensure all FCT students have a pastoral tutor, and that reporting processes are in place.
- To explore, over time, and in conversation with the Warden, areas of interest and expertise where teaching could be offered to the wider Cranmer Hall student body.
- To promote a continued awareness of the vision and values of the FCT within the life of Cranmer Hall as a whole.
- To participate in the regular prayer and worship life of Cranmer Hall, as agreed with the Warden
- To serve as a full, prayerful and constructive member of the Cranmer Hall staff team, participating in the weekly staff meeting.
- To provide occasional guest lectures on other modules as agreed with the Warden.

5. Person Specification

6. Salary and Benefits

The post is being offered on full-time basis for a fixed-term of three years. Salary, pension, grants and allowances (book and car) will be on the Lichfield Scale for the Theological College Teaching Staff. This

includes e are a salary of £26,700, a book allowance of £753 and an entertainment allowance of £152. A car allowance of £1,495 may be claimed and further mileage claims will be reimbursed at 10p per mile. Without a car allowance mileage claims will be reimbursed at 45p per mile. The pension will be provided through the Universities Superannuation Scheme (USS).

7. Housing

The post carries with it a taxable housing allowance of £13,925.

8. Meals

Collegiate meals are provided free of charge in the college communal dining rooms in term-time and during periods of 'vacation residence' (subject to availability) for the better performance of college duties. A spouse and dependent children are included in this provision when accompanying the post-holder.

9. Annual leave

The post holder is entitled to 27 days annual leave plus statutory holidays and University customary holidays (or days in lieu of those, which fall in term-time).

10. DBS Disclosure

A satisfactory DBS declaration is required at the time of taking up the post.

11. Date of Appointment and Tenure of Office

It is intended that the person appointed shall take up the post in September 2020 or as soon as possible thereafter. The post is subject to a probationary period of one year. This is a three- year fixed term position due to external part-funding of the role. Continuation of this post beyond three years would be dependent on either renewed external funding or a business case for internal funding being approved.
